Information for the application at Thomas-Morus-Burse

Dear applicant,

we are pleased that you are interested in a room in the Thomas-Morus-Burse!

The catholic student residence Thomas Morus Burse (short: TMB) offers beside the room and the shared use of various communal facilities the opportunity to get involved. Residents have the opportunity to offer regular program (e.g. choir, theatre group, sports activities such as soccer or spike ball) or one-time activities (e.g. visiting a soccer game in a stadium, hikes) for other residents. In addition, some events are organized by the main staff every semester, e.g. a welcoming evening for new residents.

We would be happy if you are motivated to get involved in the community in and outside your flat to make student residence life a little more colourful.

Your complete application should include the following documents:

- Fully filled out, signed application form with a picture. You can either fill this out digitally or print it out, fill it out by hand and scan it back in as a PDF.
Please check that all fields are completed and that your detailed CV is on the separate page. You are of course free to use additional sheets for your narrative CV.
- Completed and signed statement of commitment. Under the motto "Living together - respecting boundaries", we want to make the hall of residence a place where everyone can feel comfortable and where people treat each other with respect and respect for boundaries. We would therefore like to ask all future residents to commit to this code of conduct.
- If you are already enrolled, a current certificate of matriculation. First semester students can submit these at a later date.

If you want to submit your application documents electronically:

- You will receive an e-mail confirming that we have received your application.

About the Thomas-Morus-Burse

300 single rooms in three houses. In each of the 21 residential groups (flats) live 12-15 persons. The single rooms are fully furnished and 11.5 m² or 15 m² in size. Some of the rooms have a balcony. Each flat has a shared kitchen and shared sanitary facilities.

Room prices (running costs included):

290 € (room without balcony)

320 € (large room, without balcony)

320 € (room with balcony)

Community life:

Possibility to get involved in the community in and outside the flat to make student residence life a little more colourful. Residents have the opportunity to offer (or participate) in a regular program (e.g. choir, theatre group, sports activities such as soccer or spike ball) or one-time activities (e.g. visiting a soccer game in a stadium, hikes) for other residents. In addition, some events are organized by the main staff every semester, e.g. a welcoming evening for new residents.

The residents can use three music rooms, as well as the house chapel and some other rooms.

A counselling service is available to the residents at the residence.

Location:

Good public transport connection. To the university by bike approximately 15 minutes, to the clinics approximately 30 minutes. To the Pädagogische Hochschule (PH) by foot approximately 5 minutes.

Facilities of the house:

Each room has a television connection and internet access (included in the rent).

Application dates:

The application dates are published on the website of the Thomas-Morus-Burse.

Admission committee:

Your application documents will be read by the admissions committee, which is made up of elected student representatives and the residence management. The admissions committee will decide on the outcome of your application.

Your data will be treated confidentially. It is only accessible to the administration and to the members of the admissions committee of the Thomas Morus Burse for a limited period of time.

Admission criteria:

The Thomas Morus Burse is a student residence run by the church. Therefore, social and ecclesiastical aspects (among others) are taken into account. In addition, it is important that applicants are willing to participate in the community life inside and outside of their flats.
